



The Remembrance Project Supports the Following:

- 1. Mass Deportations.** Deport all illegal aliens, immediately. Return illegals to their countries of origin and re-unite them with their families.
- 2. Border Wall.** Complete the border wall.
- 3. No reciprocity** for Texas driver's licenses for people who move to Texas from states that give driver's license to illegal aliens.
- 4. E-verify.** In order to close the loophole on e-verify abusers, all workers on a project must be *legally authorized to work in the United States* (especially projects funded by tax dollars). Employers use contract workers/sub-contractors to avoid this law. Contractors/subs are not considered "employees"
- 5. ITIN #s.** Because the IRS gives individual tax identification numbers (ITIN) to illegal aliens, wherein illegals open businesses. With ITIN #s illegals can become a minority owned business and obtain tax-funded projects while using illegal alien workers at a much lower wage, thus placing American businesses out-of-business.
- 6. In-state college tuition.** End in-state tuition for illegal aliens. Reverse *Plyler v Doe*.
- 7. Stop aiding and abetting illegal aliens.** No business licenses or funds to non-governmental organizations (NGOs) that aid and abet illegal aliens. This "funneling" of money to aid and abet illegal must end now.
- 8. Census.** Illegal aliens must not be counted in the census. A question asking the citizenship must be included as a safeguard and used to void that particular form.
- 9. English our national language.** We support making English as our country's official language.
- 10. No Welfare.** No social benefits for illegal aliens. Preserve social benefits for only "citizens."
- 11. Sanctuary Policies.** End all official and non-official Sanctuary Policies.
