

PROCLAMATION

October is the Remembrance Month for Americans Killed by Illegal Aliens

WHEREAS, by issuance of this proclamation, I, as Governor of the State of _____, am honoring the memory of those Americans who have been killed by illegal aliens; and

WHEREAS, in October 2020, the 45th President of the United States of America, Donald J. Trump, signed The Remembrance Project’s proclamation recognizing the “National Remembrance Day for Americans Killed by Illegal Aliens”; and

WHEREAS, to honor thousands of American lives stolen by illegal acts of illegal aliens, a month-long tribute is both appropriate and necessary, therefore, I officially proclaim October as the *“The Remembrance Month for Americans Killed by Illegal Aliens”*; and

WHEREAS, the federal government’s abandonment of its constitutional responsibility to protect and defend our nation’s border, thus placing every citizen in eminent danger; and

WHEREAS, this proclamation encourages the people of our state to participate in *“The Remembrance Month for Americans Killed by Illegal Aliens”* during each October by downloading and sharing the images of America’s “Stolen Lives” memorial banners from the website, www.TheRemembranceProject.org; and

NOW THEREFORE, I officially proclaim October as the *“The Remembrance Month for Americans Killed by Illegal Aliens”* and ask that you pause to honor the memory of every American life so egregiously stolen from their families, friends, and at the hands of illegal aliens. We walk alongside and pray for their families and their dearly departed.
