



The Remembrance Project's Key Positions in Standing with American Families and Defending Our Nation

At The Remembrance Project, we speak for the countless American families whose loved ones were killed due to preventable tragedies involving illegal aliens. Our mission is rooted in love for country, compassion for victims, and a firm belief in justice. We support commonsense policies that protect American lives and uphold the rule of law. Below are the principles we champion:

- 1. No Amnesty.** We cannot continue to reward those who break our immigration laws. Amnesty sends the wrong message and invites more lawlessness.
- 2. End Birthright Citizenship.** The 14th Amendment was never intended to grant citizenship to illegal aliens. This misinterpretation has led to abuse that must end immediately, and correct previously issued document
- 3. Finish the Border Wall.** Every unprotected mile of our border is a risk to American families. Completing the border wall is a matter of safety, sovereignty, and respect for our nation's laws.
- 4. Protect the Census.** The U.S. Census should reflect our citizen population. Including illegal aliens distorts representation and unfairly shifts political power. Include a citizenship question in the Census.
- 5. Deportations.** Enforce Deportations with Compassion and Purpose. The law must be enforced. We support the return of all illegal aliens to their home countries where they can reunite with family and help build stronger communities abroad. Our Legal Defense Fund will support these efforts through Amicus Brief.
- 6. E-verify all workers.** To close the loophole on e-verify abusers, all workers must be "*legally authorized to work in the U.S.*". Corrupt employers hire illegal aliens under the category of contract workers/sub-contractors. Most egregious are home builders. Guilty employers must be held accountable.
- 7. Immigration.** With an estimated 40+ million illegal aliens currently in the U.S., our immigration policy must prioritize what benefits the American people. Assimilation, which has been grossly ignored, and lawful entry must be at the heart of any immigration system.

- 8. Stop IRS Support for Illegal Alien Businesses.** It's unacceptable that the IRS issues ITINs (Individual Tax Identification Numbers) to illegal aliens, allowing them to open businesses that hire undocumented workers at lower wages—undercutting American-owned businesses and violating federal law. Require that every business owner is legally authorized to work in the U.S. We will support this effort with our Legal Defense Fund.
- 9. End In-State Tuition for illegal aliens.** While American students pay more to attend college outside their home states, illegal aliens are receiving in-state tuition discounts. This is fundamentally unjust. We also support reversing the *Plyler v. Doe* decision that mandates taxpayer-funded education for those here illegally.
- 10. Declare English the Official Language.** A common language unites a nation. We support making English the official language of the United States to promote unity and integration.
- 11. Defund NGOs That Facilitate Illegal Immigration.** No funds or business licenses to non-governmental organizations that aid and abet illegal aliens. This “funneling” of money must be redirected to benefit citizens and communities in need.
- 12. No Reciprocity for States Issuing Illegal Alien Driver's Licenses.** States should not honor driver's licenses from states that undermine our immigration system by issuing them to illegal aliens.
- 13. Make October a Month of Remembrance.** In honor of Americans killed by illegal aliens, we call for the expansion of President Trump's Remembrance Day into a full month—each October—to remember the lives lost and the families left behind.
- 14. End Sanctuary Policies.** Sanctuary jurisdictions shield those who have violated our laws, often at great cost to innocent lives. We will use our Legal Defense Fund to help end these dangerous policies at all levels.
- 15. Protect Social Benefits for American Citizens.** Social programs are a lifeline for many Americans in need. We believe these benefits should be reserved exclusively for U.S. citizens—not extended to those here unlawfully.

The Remembrance Project is a 501c3 not-for-profit organization based in Texas and founded by Tim Lyng, P.E., and Maria Espinoza in 2009, it serves as a voice for Americans killed by illegal aliens. T.R.P. ignited the national movement and shined a light on the human cost and long-lasting impacts of illegal immigration—one name, one family, one story at a time.
